#### "Leave me alone!"

#### Parent Information Newsletter for Dental Assessment Visit to ST MARGARET MARYS

**Westmead Centre for Oral Health** will be sending home consent forms with the children from Kindergarten to Year 6 for an Oral Health Assessment, (ie:- dental assessment) and a short oral heath lesson during school hours on the following days.

### Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> JUNE and FRIDAY 17<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2016

#### The assessment at school, and any follow-up general dental treatment provided at Westmead Centre for Oral Health is free of charge

After the assessment children will be given a general result sheet to take home relating to their dental health.

Parents are welcome to access public health or their own private dentist for treatment after the assessment

The Dental Assessment will be conducted by Registered Dental Clinicians from:-Westmead Hospital, Paediatric and Orthodontic, General and Specialist Dental Department

All Paediatric Dental staff have attended child protection lectures and had criminal record checks prior to employment.

All Clinicians and Dental Assistants attending the school have experience working with children.

Patient records and students personal details will remain strictly confidential

#### No dental treatment will be carried out on the day of the assessment

#### For each child:-

Consent forms will be sent home for each child and should be returned as soon as possible to the teacher ticked **Yes or No (with details filled in and parents signature)** 

Each student, (with a form ticked **Yes and signed by a parent**) will be eligible to have a dental assessment.

The staff will bring portable Dental Chairs and lights to conduct the dental assessment. The clinician will use a sterilised mirror, wear a mask and new pair of latex free gloves for each child.

A report letter will be sent home with **each child** after their assessment. The child's details will be entered into the hospital computer and will remain confidential.

Treatment appointments will be offered on a prioritised basis and contact letters will be mailed directly to the child's address.

Students with urgent treatment needs will be offered treatment appointments first.
