Road Safety

Take time to teach traffic lessons

Road safety is a valuable lesson for our smallest pedestrians. Parents, especially those with children starting school, need to make sure that their kids are taught about the dangers of crossing the road.

Always drop of and pick up your children from your school's designated area and follow your school's road safety procedures. It is always safest to drop your children on the school side of the road and to meet them on the same side.

They should also enter and exit the car by the door closest to the kerb.

Never call to your children from across the road. Teach them to wait until you come to them and talk with them about what they should do if you are not there on time.

Children under 10 do not have the skills to be safe in traffic yet often travel to and from school unsupervised.

Children of this age are especially vulnerable around vehicles and roads because they have difficulty judging the speed and distance of moving cars, have a reduced ability to notice objects like cars in their peripheral vision and have difficulty working our where sounds are coming from.

Children tend to be impulsive and may dart into the traffic.

Children also copy what adults do and many of us ignore 'stop' or don't walk' signs or red lights.

Parents can protect their child from injury by teaching them road safety from an early age and setting a good example for them to copy.

Motorist can also play a part by slowing down in school zones and obeying parking signs. It is easy to forget 40km/h zones.

Remember to set a good example and regularly take time to educate children on road safety
