# From the Principal

Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

It has been a very busy week at St Margaret Mary's with a great deal of things happening or about to happen (Mother's Day Liturgy)! I spoke at Monday's Assembly outlining how hard all in our community have worked to improve the physical state of our school and more importantly the educational agenda in our learning spaces. With this time and energy comes greater ownership of our school and a need to acknowledge people's efforts.

The staff are undertaking their second Annual Professional Learning Plan, along with working with Teacher Educators from the Catholic Education Office at Parramatta. ### **Car Pick - up**

All cars must have their car pick up number displayed clearly in their front window.

Car Pick-up is a service we are able to offer at StMM's because of the generosity of the staff. Every weekday in the afternoon, rain, hail or shine (lucky not so much hail!!!) the staff commit to ensuring the safety of our students travelling home by car. Most, 99%, of our parents are excellent at following the procedures and are very appreciative of this service. Their smiling faces and happy nature says so every afternoon. So I felt great disappointment last week when I asked a parent, who had parked illegally, to move their car, only to be ignored and another person speak rudely about the process.

The number plate of the illegally parked car has been registered with the office and the information will be passed on to the local authorities. It is always a school decision to allow families to be part of Car Pick-up. The Catholic Education Office will be notified of the individuals who are unable to follow the procedures.

We have worked hard at ensuring the afternoon procedure works smoothly. Over 130 cars pull in and depart within a short time without any major problems. This is because most people are patient and realise the benefit of the service. Car Pick-up is working so well that we very rarely have visits from the police or council rangers (1 visit in 12 months). I would like to thank my staff for their generosity in this matter and all our parents who are following the procedures for our Car Pick-up Service and showing patience to support the school.

### **Uniforms**

All students should now be wearing the full winter uniform. Please ensure that your child is in the correct uniform and is neat and tidy.

Parents are asked to check that their child's name is clearly marked on each item of clothing especially jumpers and jackets.

# **Teaching and Learning**

# **Guiding Writers to Independence**

Oral language is important for English language learners. At St Margaret Mary's, we have a wonderfully diverse mixture of students from different cultures and language groups. All are in the process not only of becoming literate, but also of learning all aspects of English. Language is taught through interaction. Students will listen and learn, but they will learn even more as they begin to produce language. Their growth will be scaffolded by the language of the people who talk with them.

The conversations that students have with adults and each other set the tone for their learning. Talk creates a literate culture within the classroom. Through talk, concepts flow across whatever the particular activity might be.

Developing oral language helps children expand their writing abilities. Here is a summary of some important points that can guide our examination of the developing writer:

- 1. Oral language is a complex, integrated system with many subsystems—sound, language structure or syntax, and meaning.
- 2. Writers and readers use their knowledge of the sound system of language and link it with letters and letter clusters.
- 3. Writers and readers use their knowledge of the syntactic system of language to create and access meaning.
- 4. Writers and readers use their background knowledge of the world and language to create and understand texts.
- 5. Language is learned through use and is supported and expanded by interaction with more expert users.
- 6. Talking about texts is a way to expand oral language to take on the particular characteristics of written language.
- 7. School offers the opportunity for children to use oral language as a primary resource in becoming literate.
