## The Our Father

Australian Catholics takes a deeper look at some popular prayers in the Catholic tradition.

In the Gospels, Jesus gives the Our Father prayer to his disciples as an example of how to pray. That is why it is called the Lord's Prayer.

In Matthew's Gospel Jesus is less interested in telling his disciples what words to use when they pray. He wants to show them how to pray. He tells his disciples not to pray like the self-centred show-offs and motormouths of his day who could put on a great show in the temple or rattle along at a million words a minute, always about me.

The Our Father shows a simple way to pray. It is not tied up with me, but begins with a 'we'. We are to begin by praising God, then pray for the world to become the beautiful, just and peaceful place that God wants. After that we pray for our daily needs; we pray to be forgiving and so to be forgiven, and to be delivered from all our terrors.

So when we pray the Our Father we should turn outwards as will as inwards, filling out the different phrases with our own agenda. If we pray for a just world, we may think of our treatment of asylum seekers.

The daily bread we pray for is both food for the homeless and starving, and my own needs in study and social life. When I pray for forgiveness and to forgive, I remember the difficult and painful relationships in my life. The terrors we pray to be delivered from may remind me of conflict at home or my fear of social embarrassment.

When we pray the Our Father together it is helpful sometimes to leave a pause after each phrase so we can include the things in our lives and world that we want to pray for. In a trusting atmosphere we may be able to share them.
