## **Principal's Message**

### Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

This is the continuation from the last St Margaret Mary's Bulletin.

#### **Raising Children of Character: 10 Principles**

#### 6. Use Direct Teaching to Form Habits and Conscience

We need to practise what we preach, but we also need to preach what we practise. Direct teaching helps to develop a child's habits and conscience. "Pick up your toys." "Say please and thank you.' "Don't interrupt." "Look at a person who's speaking to you." Hundreds of teachings like these communicate to children, "This is how we behave," "This is how we live." Direct teaching includes explaining why some things are right and others wrong.

#### 7. Discipline Wiselv

Disciplining wisely means setting expectations, holding kids accountable to them, and responding to their lapses in a way that both teaches what's right and motivates the child to do what's right. This means discipline should be clear and firm but not harsh. An excellent approach is to ask a child, "What do you think is a fair consequence for what you did?" Together the parent and child can then agree on a consequence that will help change behaviour.

#### 8. Solve Conflicts Fairly

Conflicts provide important opportunities to foster character development. A fairness approach can be used to solve a wide range of family conflicts. It has three parts:

- 1) achieving mutual understanding;
- 2) arriving at a fair, agreed upon solution to the problem; and
- 3) holding a follow-up meeting to evaluate how the solution is working.

#### 9. Provide Opportunities to Practice the Virtues

Virtues develop through practice. We don't develop character in kids simply by talking about it; they need real responsibilities in family life. Children should not be paid for all the things they do for the house; such jobs are the way they contribute to the family.

#### **10. Foster Spiritual Development**

Young people who frequently attend religious services and say their faith is important to them show higher levels of compassion. For many people, religion gives life a higher meaning and an ultimate reason for leading a faith filled life. If we are not ourselves religious, we must nevertheless help our children to develop a spiritual vision that address life's largest questions: What is the meaning of life? What is the purpose of my life? What leads to authentic happiness?

## 2017 Parramatta Diocesan **Team Sport Trials**

Any Primary students enrolled in Parramatta Diocesan Schools in Year 5 and 6 in 2017 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term One/Two in 2017 (Winter Sports - AFL, Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby League League, Rugby Union & Touch).

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2017 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials in 2017 will be held in the following sports: \*AFL (boys), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website

www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au.This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2017 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Please ensure that the SUBMIT button has been pressed upon completing the form and notification email will be sent to the parent/guardian listed on the form confirming this expression of interest has been received.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Winter Sports Registrations close Priday 3rd February 5pm.
