Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

It is great to be back at StMM's and thank you to the many warm wishes and greetings from students and parents over the past three days. I was able to visit my elderly father in Albury before flying out to the United States for a family holiday (15 in the group) visiting all the well-known places of interest. Travel is often more than a holiday, it can be hard work, making all those connecting flights and deadlines. Added to this is missing the comforts of home and the "out of routine" element. It is this last aspect that I want to explore more with you in this bulletin.

Our routines play a vital role in our personal wellbeing and our ability to cope with the challenges of daily life. We need a routine to build a habit and you cannot have good habits without good routines. The StMM's Reading Folder for example. Each student has a Reading Folder and is expected to read each and every day. We can provide the Folder, the books, and the daily log, but reading will not become a habit unless there is a routine that is built into the child's life.

Routines provide sound structures to get things done. Organising the morning routine in the home can be a challenging task for parents. Children can have input into the routine and negotiate elements of what and when things are done, but we must be careful not to have long discussions every day about what and when things are done. Once the routine is settled, life becomes calmer. The more we follow the routine, the easier it becomes. The morning becomes a settled beginning to the day. This great start to the day means we are on time for school and thus ready for learning. We have developed the habit of preparing for our learning.

Holidays are really about taking a break from our routines. Doing things differently. I enjoyed this time but it is great to get back into sound routines and great habits.

All parents are encouraged to have the Skoolbag App as this will be the main preference for communication to all parents.

Reading Folders

Mr Mills will be visiting all grades over the next 2 weeks to check students reading logs. Parents are to encourage their child/ren to read every day.

Student Medical Information

If your child/ren suffer from asthma or have a medical condition, and you have not informed the school office, could you please do so as soon as possible.

For example, if your child suffers from asthma, please supply an updated Asthma Action Plan from your child's doctor.

All medication must be brought to the school office by a parent and a medication form completed.

School Uniforms

All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate to their age and school expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe program—No Hat No Play requires students to wear our school cap or school hat when outside. These hats and caps are available at the school office. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Please be aware that these can be dangerous during sports time. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

Upgrading School Zones

The NSW government is funding an upgrade to 85 flashing signs in the Holroyd area as part of the state-wide road and Maritime School Zone network.

New flashing signs will be installed and tested at a time outside school zone operational hours. Once the new signs are working the old signs will be removed. A small number of the signs will need to be relocated.

The existing signs are managed by council and operate n the 2G network.

This ensures they work correctly and continue keeping our kids safe.

The Roads and Maritime will carry out the work, which includes removing old posts, flashing signs and equipment and installing new posts, new flashing signs and communications equipment.

International Food Festival





How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup". 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".

8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch. Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81. Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: The Skoolbag Windows App is for 81 version Windows Phones, or Windows 81 and 10 devices.
