Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

I attended a Principal Meeting yesterday and was struck by the prayer shared by Sr Venera Nicolosi. I have included aspects for our community to reflect upon.

A reading from Matthew 16:13-15

When Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Phillippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others, Jeremiah or one of the Prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven."

Reflection

Identity is a frequently explored theme in Catholic schools. We often asked ourselves what is the identity of our Catholic schools? We know that the identity of our school is grounded in a person—the person of Christ. Like the disciples we need to hear the question "Who do you say I am?" leading to "Who is Christ for you?"

The Bishops' Pastoral Letter, "Catholic Schools at a Crossroads", speaks about; "the life and activity in the school as being the context for a personal encounter with Christ".

Let us pray

O Spirit of life you call us to be more than we can ask or even imagine. Help us to uncover the rich inner life that is ours. Surprise us with the hidden treasures we never knew we had. Give us the courage to uncover the mystic and prophet within ourselves so that we can reveal Christ to others. May we contribute to empowering others, so that each person can respond with the insight of Peter, to the question of Jesus "Who do you say I am?

We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen

Ingredients 1/2 cup popping corn 1 cup dried apricots, chopped 1 cup dried apple, chopped 1 cup sultanas



Makes 6 cups.

Method

Put the popping corn in a microwave safe dish.

Microwave on HIGH (100%) for four minutes or cook in a saucepan or electric frypan according to packet instructions.

Stand popcorn for one minute.

Mix remaining ingredients into the popcorn.
