## From the Principal

Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

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The Feeding of the Five Thousand was last week's Gospel and one of the favourite passages from the New Testament. The gathering certainly presented a number of challenges to Jesus and his supporters. I would say being a parent has a large dose of challenge and living in the 21<sup>st</sup> century provides its own challenges. As people who have chosen to send their children to a Catholic school, we are faced with the challenge of raising our children in a society that is pushing and pulling in all directions. Some of these directions are far from the path Jesus walked.

But he had two great commandments to guide him:

#### Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy 1. heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. 2.

We can use these two wonderful touchstones to help us in an ever changing world. They are statements reelecting an openness to acceptance and God's great love. Don't dismiss your child's boldness and poor attitude, they always want to push the boundaries.

#### Don't be afraid to admit when you are less than perfect, your child knows things are not always ideal.

Don't worry when things go off track, always be firm and fair as your child needs to feel secure and safe.

## Steps of building the 2<sup>nd</sup> Garden Bed

On the 23rd of July the Ultimate Garden group and Mrs Albertin went down to the bottom grass to build the second garden bed with the help of Joe our groundsman and Emmanuel. When we got there we saw our equipment set out and ready for us to use. First of all we drilled the brackets into the sleepers, secondly we dug the trenches with a



mattock and



shovel for the sleepers to go in, next we put the sleepers with the brackets in the trenches and made sure they were levelled. After that we put the 2.4 meter sleepers then drilled it into the brackets. When the garden bed was done

we put

bricks and rocks under the sleepers because the ground was not straight. That meant that the sleepers won't be level. We had so much fun building the garden bed.

## Safety Around Schools A Road Safety message from Holroyd City Council

As a new school year begins, it is important to keep road safety on the top of your mind. School zones can get very busy during drop off and pick up times, it is important for parents and children to remember to take extra care when travelling to and from school. Here are some tips to keep your children safe.



Children must ALWAYS wear a correctly fitted helmet. TIP: The helmet should fit low on the forehead so that 2 ingers fit betwen the helmet and the eyebrows.



Bicycles should be maintained regularly to ensure they are in good working coniditon.

Children under 12 years old should ride on the footpath.

Meet your child at the bus stop, NEVER on the opposite side of the

Wait until the bus has driven away before crossing the road.

Teach your child to stand back from the kerb and away from the traffic.

Remind your child if the bus has seatbelts, they must buckle up.
