Student Medical Information

If your child/ren suffer from asthma or have a medical condition, and you have not informed the school office, could you please do so as soon as possible.

For example, if your child suffers from asthma, please supply an updated Asthma Action Plan from your child's doctor.

All medication must be brought to the school office by a parent and a medication form needs to be completed by the parent.

Photo Permission

From time to time photos and/or video footage of your child will be taken at school and school events. These photos and video footage may be used in the school newsletter, diocesan newsletter, in newspapers, brochures, advertising, websites or in publications.

If you do not wish for photos or videos of your child to be published or shown on the website please notify the school office in writing by Friday, 16th February, 2018.

Allergies

As you may or may not be aware there are a number of children attending our school who have severe allergies to many different foods. This means that if these children come in contact with any food products they will have a severe allergic reaction.

We also ask that you remind your child/ren not to share their lunch or any other food with another child.

Change of Classes

Due to an increase in student enrolments at St Margaret Mary's there have been changes in some student classes. These changes were made to balance the number of students in classes. We are certainly reaching the tip of capacity.

School Uniforms

All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate to their age and school expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe programs require students to wear our school cap or hat when outside No Hat No Play. These hats and caps are available at the school office. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn.

Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

Change of Details

If you have moved house or changed your contact details, please notify the school office as soon as possible to update your details in case of an emergency.

Crunch and Sip

Just a reminder that Crunch and Sip is a break during class when students can refuel on fruit or vegetables and rehydrate on water. The break assists students with physical and mental performance, and concentration in the classroom.

There is no supervision in the mornings before the 8:15am bell. From 8:15am until the 8:30am bell it is a walk and talk time only. Students are reminded that there is to be NO running or ball games in the playground in the mornings. If you are dropping your child/ren off or picking them up from the Parish Car Park please remind your child/ren about the safety around cars and the dangers of running in this area..

Parents are also reminded that they need to collect their child/ren from school at 3:00pm. If you are running late please contact the school office. The school office is open from 8:15am to 3:15pm every day.

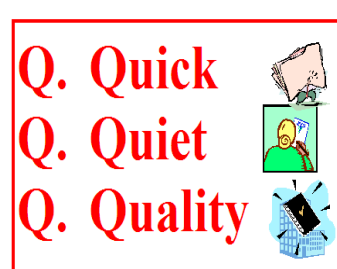
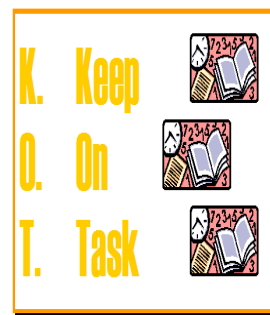
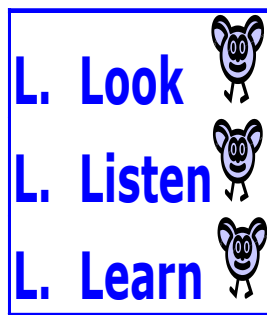
Partnership

Parent/Teacher Interviews

The format for our Parent/Teacher meeting in Term 1 will be finalised at the staff meeting this week. A separate note will go home at a later date with all the information including dates and booking details.

Car Pick Up

Any parent wishing to join Car Pick Up will need to see the office to complete a form and be issued with a car number to be displayed on their front windscreen. Children will be given a corresponding number to attach to their bag. It is important that all parents involved in this service are attentive to the rules of the road.



Book Club

Approximately twice a term children are given the opportunity to order books from Scholastic Book Club. It is important that when you are ordering items offered by Scholastic that you read the information provided in the catalogue regarding the product. If you are not fully satisfied with your purchase parents are asked to contact Scholastic as the school's role is only ordering and distribution.

It is not compulsory to order these books. The order forms will be sent home with your child and are to be completed and returned to the school with the exact money (no change will be given). Payment can be made by cash or through the scholastic on line ordering for credit cards payments. Please ensure that your child's name, class and amount enclosed are clearly marked on the envelope as well as on the order form.

Parents now have the opportunity to order their child/ren's books directly from Scholastics via the parent LOOP. Information regarding the LOOP can be found on the Scholastic website or through the brochure sent home with your child.

Student Banking

St Margaret Mary's participates in the student banking program which is run by the Commonwealth Bank. If your child is in years 1-6 and has a student banking account, they can participate in this program.

Student Banking Day is on **Tuesdays** and will commence on **Tuesday, 27th February**. Students need to bring their bank books to school on this day and hand it to their class teacher. If your child would like to open a bank account, you can open an account at the Commonwealth Bank online.

Cerdon College Students

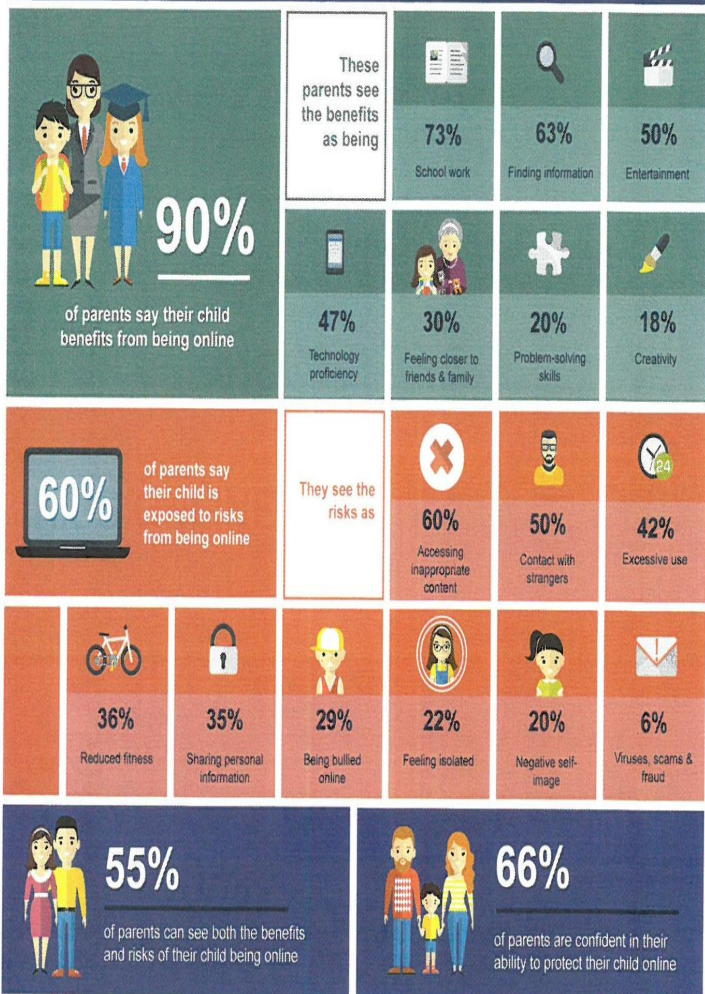

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "Install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

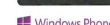
1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
3. Install the Skoolbag app
4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.
