### **Photo Permission**

From time to time photos and/or videos footage of your child will be taken at school and school events. These photos may be used in the school newsletter, diocesan newsletter, brochures, advertising, newspaper, website or publications and video footage. If you do not wish for your child/ren's photos to be taken and published, please advise the school office in writing.

### **Nut Allergies**

As you may or may not be aware there are a number of children attending our school who have nut allergies. This means that if these children come in contact with any nut products they will have a severe allergic reaction.

We are asking that children refrain from bringing food to school that may contain nuts. (Nutella, Peanut Butter, Muesli bars etc.) We also ask that you remind your child/ren not share their lunch or any other food with another child.

### **Change of Classes**

Due to an increase in student enrolments at St Margaret Mary's there have been slight changes in some student classes. These changes were made to balance the number of boys to girls ratio.

### **School Uniforms**

All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate to their age and school expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe program—No Hat No Play requires students to wear our school cap or school hat when outside. These hats and caps are available at the school office. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Please be aware that these can be dangerous during sports time. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

### **School Fees 2016**

All school fee statements will be posted out by the CEDP within the next couple of weeks. If you have any queries regarding fees please contact Mrs Maria Pagano at the school office.

### **Evacuation Training**

One day next week we will be holding a Fire Evacuation Drill for the whole school as part of our WHS Safety Training. Please note that this will become a normal procedure throughout the year for all students, staff and visitors. If you are on school premises at the time of the evacuation please follow all instructions from staff.

### Car Pick Up

Any parents wishing to join Car Pick Up will need to see the office to fill out a form and be issued with a number to be displayed on their windscreens. Children will be given a corresponding number to attach to their bag. It is important that all parents involved in this service be attentive to the rules of the road.



### **Crunch and Sip**

Just a reminder Crunch and Sip is a break during class when students can refuel on fruit or vegetables and rehydrate on water. The break assists students with physical and mental performance, and concentration in the classroom.

### **Student Banking**

St Margaret Mary's participates in the student banking program which is run by the Commonwealth Bank. If your child is in years 1-6 and has a student banking account, they can participate in this program.

Student Banking Day is on **Tuesdays** and will commence on **Tuesday, 16th February**. Students need to bring their bank books to school on this day and hand it to their class teacher. If your child would like to open a bank account, you can open an account at the Commonwealth Bank online.

### **Book Club**

Approximately twice a term children are given the opportunity to order



books from Ashton Scholastic Book Club. It is important that when you are ordering items offered by Ashton that you read the information provided in the catalogue regarding the product. If you are not fully satisfied with your purchase parents are asked to contact Ashton as the school's role is only ordering and distribution.

It is not compulsory to order these books. The order forms will be sent home with your child and are to be completed and returned to the school with the exact money (no change will be given). Payment can be made by cash, cheque or credit card. Please ensure that the child's name, class and amount enclosed are clearly marked on the envelope as well as on the order form.

Parents now have the opportunity to order their child/ren's books directly from Scholastics via the parent LOOP. Information regarding the LOOP can be found on the Scholastic website or through the brochure sent home with your child.

### **Child Protection**

Parents wishing to help out on school excursions, in classrooms, in the canteen, at sporting activities, P&F activities, or any activity that involves contact with students other than your own, MUST complete the Child Protection Module and Working with Children Check.

This is a requirement as part of the child protection within schools. If you completed the child protection module in 2014, you are required to redo the module in 2016. If you completed the module last year, 2015, you do not need to redo the module until next year.

To access the module go to <a href="http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au">http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au</a> (Completing this module you must renew every 2 years).

It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and for existing volunteers.

#### To use the module:

- **1.** Open the module by clicking start.
- **2.** Read through the presentation.
- **3.** Complete and submit quiz questions. This will take approximately 45 minutes.
- **4.** After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing your name, email address, contact number, contact address and the school you intend to volunteer at.
- **5.** A notification of your successful completion of the module will be sent via e-mail to the school and also to your email address.

You also need to complete the Working with Children Check. This is can be obtained by visiting the following website. <a href="http://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au">http://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au</a> and follow all the instructions. You then must register through the Roads and Maritime Services. This is also free and allows you to help out at any voluntary activity where children are concerned. This is a <a href="5">5</a> year certificate.

Never call your child across the road, wait for them on the school side.


