Skoolbag

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

- Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device
- Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install". The app is FREE to download. When installed click "Open"

6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"

- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.
- You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app
- Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb

 Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

If you DO NOT WISH your child in Kindergarten, Year One or Year Two to receive a certificate and have their name appear in the PRC Honour Roll please let your child's class teacher know by Friday, 12th May.
