What are the signs of your child bullying others?

It is likely that a teacher, parent, or another child will tell you if your child is bullying others.

Your child may be:

- Using verbal or physical aggression to deal with conflict
- Talking about "getting even" with others
- Blaming others for their behaviour
- Being unwilling to accept responsibility for their actions
- Coming home with items or money that don't belong to them
- Hanging around with other children who appear aggressive
 Having a hard time expressing feelings and understanding
- Having a nard time expressing leenings and understanding others' feelings
- Unable to play cooperative games (is an arrogant winner and a sore loser)
- Reacting to questioning with anger or avoidance
- Playing inappropriately with much younger children
- Putting down other children in conversations
- Impulsive
- Fighting often with brothers and sisters
