Year Three Mufti Day




I Am

include all students and staff in the photo. The students were arranged in the shape of 75.






Working With Year Three

Year Three were fortunate enough to have Danny, a student from Fairfield Patrician Brothers, working with them last week. The students were grateful for his willingness to




participate in activities, share his talents and help whenever needed. The students and teachers really appreciated and enjoyed having Danny work with them!



Delany College in Granville, to enjoy looking at the amazing masterpieces. A number of primary schools from our area had entered the



- the past (Captain Cook, Caroline Chisholm, Albert Einstein).



Just a reminder, we are still taking pre-orders for the 75th Anniversary Yearbook.


The Yearbook will contain the history and milestones of the 75 Years of the school.
