Teaching & Learning

Year 6 Electrical Creations

Year 6 have been learning about renewable and nonrenewable energy, as well as electrical circuits in Science this term. We have been fortunate enough to have had an engineer working with Year 6, Peter Bach, who is part of a program with the CSIRO and Thales. Peter visited Year 6 and taught them about electrical circuits and built a potato clock with some students. He also shared information about his job which involves designing SONAR software programs for submarines in the Australian Navy.

Using their knowledge of simple and parallel circuits, Year 6 used their creativity to build something incorporating these circuits. Some students made buzzer games, lighthouses, runways, cars,



dance floors, ferris wheels and houses. Other electrical creations included: a robot with a pulley system, a boat, a train, a



tunnel with a pressure pad, a scribble box, a helicopter landing pad with helicopter, an ice skating rink and a maths quiz game. Well done to the Year 6 students who built some imaginative and clever creations.







Spin! Spin around like a fidget spinner! On Wednesday, 14th of September, Year 4 had a Science Incursion. We had a special scientist visit us whose name was Mitch. He was an expert in the field of friction and forces. The first thing we learnt about was how to create more friction or less friction. Did you know bearings can remove friction?

We also learned about gyrospheres. A gyrosphere is a spinning object. It is very good at balancing, just like a beyblade and also helps to turn rockets in space!

Did you know that a lever can help create a larger force? Shakira Georges was strong enough to lift Mrs Attard... with the help of a lever of course!
