# **Principal's Message**

Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

#### Suffering: Persecuted for My Sake

(Richard Rhor: Edited by Kevin Mills)

You're blessed when your commitment to God provokes persecution. The persecution drives you even deeper into God's kingdom. . . . And know that you are in good company. My prophets and witnesses have always gotten into this kind of trouble. Matthew 5:10



Óscar Romero (1917–1980) was named a saint by the

Catholic Church. Pope Francis canonized seven people, including the late Salvadoran archbishop Oscar Arnulfo Romero, who was shot by an assassin as he celebrated mass in a hospital chapel, on March 24, 1980. He will henceforth be known as Saint Oscar Romero.

As Archbishop of San Salvador for the last four years of his life, Romero was a strong, public voice for the many voiceless and anonymous poor of El Salvador and Latin America. When he preached in the cathedral on Sunday mornings, the streets were empty and all the radios were on full volume, to hear truth and sanity in an insane and corrupt world.

Here was a man who suffered with and for those who suffered. His loving heart shines through clearly in his homilies:

"We . . . don't want to be a plaything of the worldly powers, rather we want to be the Church that carries the authentic, courageous Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, even when it might become necessary to die like he did, on a cross."

In a homily a few weeks before his death, Romero addressed his congregation directly:

I have often been threatened with death. I must tell you, as a Christian, I do not believe in death without resurrection. If I am killed, I shall arise in the Salvadoran people. I say so without boasting, with the greatest humility.... A bishop will die, but God's church, which is the people, will never perish.

A few weeks later he was shot through his heart as he stood at the altar.

As a principal, I have always been driven by his words "A bishop will die, but God's church, which is the people, will never perish." Some parishes have a beautiful church but no people, some parishes have no church but many people. We have been blessed at Merrylands with dedicated priests, people of strong faith and a building where we gather, worship and go forward to be people of action.

# **Teaching & Learning**

### **Information Technology and** Communication

The CEDP provides a range of services to support the learning of all students in our school. Our children's access to the internet and a number of ICT devices are key in bring the outside world into Merrylands. It is important to understand and follow security policies and procedures to lessen the risks of accidental or inappropriate actions both at home and at school. Everyone has a role to play in helping to detect and report security incidents early, this can reduce the effect across our school.

The most important thing to remember in regards to maintaining security is that you are the first line of defence. You can help prevent ICT security incidents by being watchful for:

- Your computer crashing
- Unusual error messages or your computer running at a slower speed.
- Unusual/suspicious emails
- Anyone installing and or using unauthorised software
- Inappropriate social media and website requests

StMM's will follow the protocols of all organisations in regard to reporting any concerns or breaches of guidelines. If appropriate we will inform authorities, including the Federal Office of the Australian Information Commissioner, software companies and Police.
