Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Boys & Girls,

The following extract is from Sr Leone and I share it with you as we journey through Lent;

The following prayer beautifully captures the longing of the Church for the world. It is described as a prayer for the courage to embrace the world in the name of Christ, and it reads:

> 'Father in heaven, the love of your Son led him to accept the suffering of the cross that we whose humanity he shared might glory in new life. Change our selfishness into self-giving. Help us to embrace the world you have given us, that we may transform the darkness of its pain into the life and joy of Easter.'



'Help us to embrace the world'. This needs courage, for it is a lot easier to stand back and, from a safe distance, criticise the false values condoned or encouraged by others. Of course there is a place for criticism. Our personal experience, however, is that criticism is helpful only when it comes from love. This is because when someone does not love us we know that they do not understand us, and so we tend to defend ourselves against criticism that is felt as unjust.

It is the same in the public arena. When Christians criticise without love, those who are criticised will defend themselves against the criticism that they see as unenlightened. When this happens nothing good is achieved. Furthermore Christians who act in this way are not following Jesus whose command was to love one another. If we love we may well be in a position to criticise. If we do not love we had better be silent.

Next time we find ourselves criticising any person, could we ask ourselves two questions. Firstly do I know this person? Do I really know him or her? If I don't, then there may be a place for criticizing what he or she is doing, but there is no place for criticising the person. And the second question is: If I know this person do I love him or her? If I do, then perhaps there is a place for criticism born of love. If not, then let silence guard my tongue lest I only harden the position I are aiming to correct and thus contribute to the harm that I seek to oppose.

Congratulations on your attendance this term. We are currently in the top 20 in the diocese at 89.7%. Congratulations to Year 3 who are currently at 95.1% attendance, followed by Kindy on 94.1%, Yr 4 90.4%, Yrs 1 88.2%, Yr 2 87.4%, Yr 5 87.3% and then Yr 6 85.4%. Congratulations to all the students who will receive a Personal Growth award for 95% and above attendance.

Please remember attendance at school is very important in your child's learning.

Canteen News

We will take Term 2 as a time to refurbish the canteen space. We have put in place a service for our students from a neighbouring school. They will take orders and have them delivered to the school each day (further instructions on how to order will be communicated in the near future). We will be working from a simple cold option menu and this will be for term 2 only – Normal canteen will resume from term 3.


Harmony Day display off the LARC windows.

Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school


There have been a number of issues recently during Morning DropOff at our Top Gate in Davies St. Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Make sure your children are **fastened** in the correct child car seat for their age and size and that it is fitted correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pickup area.
- Never call out to them from across the road they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.
